- November 20: Council officially adopted Roadmap.
- November 22: Council presented Roadmap to House Higher Education Committee.
- December 3: Council submitted Roadmap to the Legislature.

Council Position



Staff authorized to support, oppose, or comment on legislation without Council action.

- Legislation impacts *operations* of agency-administered program (e.g. SNG disbursement process)

Informational Testimony



No position unless Council members vote on position. Staff authorized to provide informational testimony.

- Legislation impacts Council or agency structure
- Legislation impacts <u>policies</u> of an agency-administered program (e.g. SNG eligibility)

Tracking Only

No position, no testimony. Staff will track legislation and update Council as necessary.

• Legislation impacts Council sector representatives (COP, CTCs, ICW, OSPI) and/or education agencies, organizations, and/or institutions
