11th grade Smarter Balanced test scores tell you what you need to work on before you graduate high school, and they tell colleges whether or not you're ready for college-level courses.

Take a Bridge to College course your senior year if you score a 1 or 2.

1

You can still go to college if you score a 1. You'll need more support in your senior year, and you may have to take a remedial course your first year of college.

2

You can place directly into entry-level courses at community and technical colleges if you score a 2 **and** get a "B" or better in your Bridge to College course.

You're ready for college-level math and English if you score a 3 or 4.

3

If you score a 3 or 4, many colleges won't require remedial courses or additional tests before you enroll in college-level math and English. Consider taking a dual-credit course to earn college credit your senior year in high school.

Check with the colleges you're interested in to find out if they have additional requirements.
