

## WEIAOB 2024 Legislative Session Summary—April 25, 2024

## **Recommended Proposals**

On January 4, 2024, the Board recommended 16 budget and policy proposals from postsecondary education stakeholders based on their alignment with the Board's guiding principles and performance accountability metrics. **The inclusion of each proposal (or lack thereof) in the enacted 2024 supplemental operating budget is noted below.**

## Other Postsecondary Education Legislation

In addition to proposals recommended by the Board, the legislature passed multiple bills related to postsecondary education during the 2024 session. Some of them were also consistent with the Board's guiding principles and performance accountability metrics, including:

- <u>HB 2019</u>—creating a Native American apprentice assistance program
- <u>HB 2025</u>—eliminating State Work Study salary matching requirements for employers facilitating college access work
- SB 5953—allowing incarcerated students to access federal and state financial aid
