Context

- Conducted for almost 30 years
- Annual survey, continuous data collection
- Used by:
 - Employers
 - Students
 - Career Counselors
 - Students
 - Parents
 - University departments and administrators



Administration

- Annual report with rolling, quarterly data collection
- Targeting 3-6 months after graduation, survey data collected via:
 - online through our website
 - up to 2 emails with a link to the survey
 - mail up to 2 hardcopies of the survey
 - up to 2 phone calls
- List of non-respondents to academic departments
- Results available each April



Results (2009-10)

- Response Rate: 54% of the 2,993 Bachelor degree graduates
- 72% reporting employment (69% last year)
- 44% employment in field-related positions (40% last year)
- Average starting salary was \$34,068 (down \$124 from last year)



Results (2009-10)

Majors with top average starting salaries:

•	Electronics Engineering Technology	\$62,750
•	Computer Science	\$55,400
•	Plastics Engineering Technology	\$55,100
•	Manufacturing & Supply Chain Mgt	\$50,541
•	Vehicle Engineering	\$48,714
•	Bus Admin-Management	\$43,667
•	Industrial Design	\$43,500
•	Decision Sciences	\$43,391
•	Financial Economics	\$42,700
•	Accounting	\$42,254



Results (2009-10)

- Graduate & Professional Schools
 - 14.3% of undergraduates continuing their education (second highest to last year's 15.1%)
 - Admitted to competitive programs across the nation:
 - Duke University (Psychology)
 - Cornell University (Chemistry)
 - Georgetown University (Law)
 - University of British Columbia (Political Science)
 - University College London (Linguistics)
 - Vanderbilt University (Audiology)
