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Council begins review of minimum college admission standards

Olympia — On Apr. 8, the Washington Student Achievement Council will discuss the anticipated review of minimum college admission standards for public baccalaureate institutions. The Council periodically reviews these standards to ensure alignment between K-12 and higher education. The council and WSAC staff will meet with education partners this spring to gather input.

The council will also continue discussion of how an affordability framework for higher education could better inform state funding and policy. Other agenda items include an update on the current legislative session and a synopsis of the three Council Committees' current work. The meeting will also include time to continue development of the Council's 2015 Roadmap update, a report due to the Legislature in December 2015.
